His contributions were described as:




The FOTL are a dedicated group of volunteers who donate over \$100,000 each year to the Torrance Public Library Programs, services and materials, selling one used book at a time. Burt volunteers with FOTL 5 to 7 days per week, sorting donations, pricing and listing items on the internet and packaging each sale to take to the post office. He was the pioneer of selling books directly online and friends of the library groups come to Torrance to see how it is done. Burt is also an avid artist who makes beautiful dichroic glass jewelry and glass art objects. 

Reading Takes You Everywhere!

The All Ages Summer Reading Program at Torrance Public Library

Participants of all ages are invited to join Torrance Public Library's 2018 Summer Reading Program, Reading Takes You Everywhere: Monday, June 18 through Saturday, August 25. This year's theme is tied to exploration and discovery and emphasizes adventure and travel in a wide variety of areas including space, literature, and nature.

The 2018 Summer Reading Program features programs for all ages, including family friendly performances, storytimes, crafts, book discussions, movie screenings, an author panel, travel scrapbooking, instruction on basic backpacking, and learning about the National Parks.

What's new and exciting about this year's Summer Reading Program? It is a combined program for children, teens, and adults of all ages. The program has been expanded to 10 weeks (from 7 weeks) to provide better service to the community and greater exposure to the Library's services and programs.

Participants may register and track their reading activities from any Internet connection, such as while traveling, at work, and at home. Online participation is a new format offered via the Library's webpage and is another way for children, teens, and adults to connect with the Library.

Summer Reading Program participants may self-select from 4 categories: Pre-readers, Readers, Teens, and Adults.

Pre-readers are generally pre-kindergarten ages and the goal is to complete 24 early literacy activities. Examples include reading a book, attending storytime, reciting the alphabet, or singing a song. Pre-readers earn a prize midway and a final prize and certificate when they complete all 24 activities. Readers are generally elementary school ages and the goal is to complete 8 hours of reading. They earn a prize midway and a final prize and certificate once the program is completed. The Teen category is generally equivalent to middle school and high school ages. The goal is to complete 16 hours of reading and participants in the Teen category receive a prize when they have completed all 16 hours of reading.

Adults are invited to continue to learn and discover by reading books, exploring databases, and attending programs. The goal for participants in the Adult category is to complete 8 activities. Examples include reading a book, watching a movie or educational video, listening to a music CD or audiobook, learning a new skill through the library's online databases, or attending a library program. Participants will receive a prize when they have completed all 8 activities.

The 2018 All Ages Summer Reading Program would not be possible without the generous support of the Friends of the Torrance Library.
